More important than any strategy we create, our foundation must be in prayer. Great spiritual dividends have resulted in the efforts of God's people touching a community through intercession. So, as you walk, pray for impossible things to happen in your city and county (Luke 18:27). This pocket card is provided to guide you in prayerwalking.







Follow-up & Harvest Strategies

3 Levels of Follow-Up

Your association's follow-up with your churches

 Your churches' follow-up with their communities

 Your churches' follow-up with those who make professions of faith

Associational Follow-Up

- Goal: Encourage churches to see GTEH as an ongoing strategy, not just a one-time evangelistic event.
- Help churches to see the homes they visit as their primary evangelistic assignment.



Associational Follow-Up

- Prayer
- Encouragement
- Resources
- Evangelistic opportunities



•Goal: Help churches to keep the conversation going until the gospel has saturated every community.



- Encourage churches to have an evangelistic plan beyond initial GTEH distribution <u>BEFORE</u> the distribution takes place.
- In other words, churches should be able to answer, "What's next?"



- Evangelistic events
 - VBS
 - Block parties
 - Seasonal evangelistic events (Easter, Fourth of July, Trunk or Treat, Christmas, etc.)
 - Associational evangelistic crusade
 - Online events



- Schedule second round of visits
 - •"Do you have any questions?"



- Utilize existing outreach & mercy ministries
- Encourage churches to plan regular outreach projects at least quarterly in order to maintain visibility in the community
 - "Ya'll come" vs. "Therefore go"



Follow-Up with Professions

- •Goal: Every person who makes a profession of faith gets connected with a local church.
 - Decisions vs. Disciples



Follow-Up with Professions

- Help your churches develop a strategy
- At the very least, make sure that everyone who makes a profession of faith gets a phone call as soon as possible
 - Use phone call to schedule follow-up visit or video call



Follow-Up with Professions

- As you consult with churches, you may discover that many do not have a clearly defined discipleship process
 - This may lead you or other associational leaders to further assist in developing one





Primary Takeaway

Help churches in your association to use GTEH to begin or continue an ongoing evangelistic strategy to saturate their community with the gospel of Jesus Christ.










Why Do We Need a Roadmap?

- A Roadmap guides us into the <u>preferred</u> future.
- A Roadmap is necessary for the journey to be <u>clear and productive</u>.
- A Roadmap is necessary for accomplishing the tasks God has called you to do.






It is an *overview* of the association's plan for enlisting and equipping churches to engage their communities with the Gospel message, so that, saturation might occur to the greatest extent possible.





It defines the *relationships* between your context, the goal, the resources, and the process.





It guides the *connectivity* of the churches and the *flow* of resources towards the common goal of the associational GTEH effort.




To get a handle on this issue of flow, try to answer the following questions:

- Why should a church in the association participate?
- How will you explain the vision and goal of the GTEH initiative to your churches?
- What is the first step for participation by a church?
- What training will be provided?



To get a handle on this issue of flow, try to answer the following questions:

- How will churches request and receive needed resources from the association?
- Why and how should churches report their results to the association?
- What will be celebrated and how will the effort be transitioned to ongoing city-wide efforts?





It informs the *measurable results* of involvement for the association as a whole and your churches in particular.

What are Characteristics of Effective Roadmap Markers?

- Consistent with vision (destination), strategic components (tasks), and resources available
- Realistic in terms of time projections and sequence
- A steady flow of relationship between roadmap markers (no gaps)
- Critical / Primary roadmap markers are limited in number
- Each critical roadmap marker has a due date (with flexibility) and person responsible assigned to it



How do we build our Association's GTEH Strategic Roadmap?

Step 1. Gather a GTEH Strategic Planning Team.

Step 2. Consider with your team the context of your association and churches.

Step 3. Brainstorm roadmap markers that need to be accomplished during your selected time frame.

Step 4. Identify your <u>critical</u> roadmap markers—those that if not completed will most likely mean the ultimate goal for your association will not be met.





How do we build our Association's GTEH Strategic Roadmap?

Step 5. Arrange your critical roadmap markers in a process-oriented sequence.

Step 6. Under each of your Critical Roadmap Markers, identify the sub tasks that must be completed (supporting mileposts).

Step 7. Project a realistic timeline to accomplish your Critical Roadmap Markers.

Step 8. Identify needed personnel, budget, and other resources to accomplish each task for your association's GTEH journey.
