

Door to Door Conversations Cheat Sheet (Boone's Creek Baptist Church):

If there is a closed gate or nobody answers the door

- Leave the bag on the porch or near the gate opening. Do not put a bag in or on the mailbox

If someone answers the door:

- "Hello, my name is _____ and this is _____ from Boone's Creek Baptist Church. What is your name? Thank you _____, do you have a few minutes to talk?"
- If the answer is "No":
 - "No problem, we'd like to leave this bag with you, it has some information about our church and how to become a Christian. If you have any questions, please call or visit our website where you can get in touch with us." (Point out this information on the brochure.)
- If the answer is "Yes":
 - "Thank you _____, we're trying to serve our community by visiting homes near our church to share the good news of Jesus and see how we can be praying for our neighbors."
 - "_____, would you consider yourself a Christian, or are you still trying to figure it out?"

If "Yes" <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - "That's wonderful! Do you mind me asking how you know you're a Christian?" 	If "No," or "I'm trying to figure it out." <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - "We've been talking about the gospel at church, it's good news that allows us to know that our sins are forgiven and that we can have a right relationship with God. Let me briefly share this good news with you."
<i>If the answer involves anything other than trusting in the work of Jesus on our behalf, (ex: attend _____ church, prayed a prayer/baptized when I was a kid, good person, etc.) gently explain that while those things are good, only trusting in the work of Jesus is enough to make us right with God. Then —></i>	<i>Use the "What is the gospel" tract. Explain that putting our faith in Jesus is the only way we can be made right with God, and the only way we can be sure we will go to heaven. You can let them look over the copy in the bag while you walk them through it using the key words, God, Man, Christ, Response</i>
<i>If they truly are trusting in Christ, ask them what church they attend, encourage them to remain faithful to their church family, but let them know that they would be welcome to visit BCBC if they would like.</i>	<i>If the person wants to become a Christian, tell them that you will pray, and then give them the opportunity to pray. Show them Rom. 10:9-10 and instruct them to confess to God that they are a sinner and ask God to forgive them based on Jesus' sacrifice for them. Record their decision and let them know someone from the church will reach out to them.</i>

- *If they still have questions or are not quite ready to commit to becoming a believer, gather as much contact information as they are willing to share and write down their questions on the clipboard. Let them know that someone from the church will be reaching out to them to answer their questions.*
- "_____, Thank you so much for your time today. Before we go, we would like to pray for you today. Is there anything specific you would like us to pray for? Can we record this request so our pastor can be praying for you also?"
 - *Write down their request along with any contact information they would be willing to share.*
