Lesso	on # 1: Why tarping is needed?				
1.	High winds often cause damage to roofs; one of the most parts of a home and also one of the most

1.	Do not attempt to stand on a roof that is pitched.				
2.	. Always work in or groups. Never tarp a roof alone.				
3.	. Do not attempt to on a tarp-especially if it is wet.

5.	Utilize harness equipment to protect against falls.				
6.	It is important to use ladders in order to prevent accidents.				
7.	Set the ladder into position at a good, making sure the top of the ladder extends at least two feet past the				
	bottom of the roof.				
8.	You should always have a second support the ladder from below when someone is on the ladder.				
9.	Do not carryin your hand while climbing a ladder. Attach them to your safety belt or have a member of				
	the ground crew hand them up to you.

A Day in the Life of DR Tarping

April 2022

6:30 a.m. Get cup of coffee and take care of personal hygiene.

7 a.m. Breakfast/ Morning Orders of the day and devotion.

Make sack lunch, plan transportation

Blue Hat will make drink plan and cooler transport of lunches.

Blue Hat will hand out address of first Work Order

Goal: be at first work site near 8 a.m. **fog, frost or heavy dew will cause adjustments in timing. Those working conditions are unsafe!

- Final bathroom break—Load up in vehicle assignments.
- Assemble at work site: team plans job, accept assignments, Pray.
- Person assigned to First Aid Posts address, checks First Aid Kit.
- Ground crew organizes to focus on needs of roof crew.
- Trailer Captain hands out tools, Ladders go up.
- Tarps are cut, materials & tools are roped up.
- Tarp remnants are marked with measurements.
- Chaplain looks for opportunities to engage homeowner and neighbors.
- · Security watches over trailer assets.
- Blue Hat and Administrative Assistant (AA) are diligent assessing safety issues for all aspects of team.
 AA pulls Bible & starts getting signatures. Team takes water and safety breaks. AA makes call to check on next Work Order. Team Techie shoots Video & Stills: Before, During and After.
- Roofers Safely descend, tools and ladders loaded on trailer.
- Trailer Captain checks tool count returned to trailer.
- Memorial Bible presented, bathroom considerations. AA secures Work Order signatures of team.
- AA hands out address of next Work Order.
- Blue Hat assesses fatigue level of team and adjusts assignments for next Job based upon observed skills and how to strengthen team for work later in the week. AA checks weather report.

Blue Hat plans Lunch, assignments, quitting time, completes paperwork.

Summary Priorities

- 1. With minimal skills you can contribute significantly to a Tarping Crew.
- 2. Tarping trailer is fully equipped. Most needed: ground crew.
- 3. Safety is everyone's job.
- 4. Ministry and healing are more important than Tarping.
